Performing the Victorian Jan 24 2020 *Performing the Victorian: John Ruskin and Identity in Theater, Science, and Education* by Sharon Aronofsky Weltman is the first book to examine Ruskin's writing on theater. In works as celebrated as *Modern Painters* and obscure as *Love's Meinie*, Ruskin uses his voracious attendance at the theater to illustrate points about social justice, aesthetic practice, and epistemology. These theatrical depictions may be compared to concurrent plays about Ruskin's friend and student Oscar

Wilde (Gross Indecency: The Three Trials of Oscar Wilde, The Judas Kiss). Like Ruskin, Wilde is misrepresented on the fin-de-millennial stage, in his case anachronistically as an icon of homosexual identity. These recent characterizations offer a set of static identity labels that constrain contemporary audiences more rigidly than the mercurial selves conjured in the prose of either Ruskin or Wilde.
